It takes place in 1948. Lucille Fletcher wrote the picture script from her own popular radio drama. It has had 86% good reviews.</p>	<p>It was filmed in Hollywood & Los Angeles in California. It was a Hal Willis Production, and was filmed in black and white. They produced it in 1943 and 1960 as a radio station series.</p>
